Each year, the Lusophone African Studies Organization awards a prize to a **graduate student or a junior scholar** presenting a paper at the African Studies Association (ASA) annual meeting.

To be eligible, you must:

- Be a current graduate student or recent PhD or MA recipient (2015 or later)
- Present a Lusophone-related paper at the 2018 ASA meeting

Submissions may be works-in-progress. Only authors *attending* the 2018 ASA meeting will be considered for the award. Co-authored papers may be submitted where the lead author is a graduate student or recent PhD.
